&lt;p>&lt;/p>&lt;/p>&lt;p>Under Hidalgo, France flourished, mainly due to the accolades of great players like defenders Marius Tr&#233;sor and Maxime Bossis, striker&#129522; Dominique Rocheteau and midfielder Michel Platini, who, alongsi de Jean Tigana, Alain Giresse and Luis Fern&#225;ndez formed the &quot;carr&#233 ; magique&quot; (&quot;Magic&#129522; Square&quot;), which would haunt opposing defenses beginning at the 1982 World Cup, where France reached the semi-finals l osing on penalties&#129522; to rivals West Germany. The semi-final match-up is c onsidered one of the greatest matches in World Cup history and was&#129522; mark ed by controversy.[19] France finished fourth overall, losing the third-place pl ayoff 3 2 to Poland. France earned their first major international&#129522; hono r two years later, winning Euro 1984, which they hosted. Under the leadership of Platini, who scored a tournament-high nine&#129522; goals, France defeated Spai n 2 0 in the final. Platini and Bruno Bellone scored the goals. Following the Eu ro triumph, Hidalgo&#129522; departed the team and was replaced by former intern ational Henri Michel. France subsequently won gold at the 1984 Summer Olympics&# 129522; football tournament and, a year later, defeated Uruguay 2 0 to win the A rtemio Franchi Trophy, an early precursor to the&#129522; FIFA Confederations Cu p. Dominique Rocheteau and Jos&#233; Tour&#233; scored the goals. In a span of a year, France were holders&#129522; of three of the four major international tro phies. At the 1986 World Cup, France were among the favorites to win&#129522; th e competition. For the second consecutive World Cup, they reached the semi-final s and faced West Germany. Again, they were defeated&#129522; by Germany but achi eved third place with a 4 2 victory over Belgium.&lt;/p>

Located in Saint-Denis, a Parisian suburb, the stadium has an all-seater&#129522; capacity of 81,338. France&#39;s first match at the stadium was played on 28 January 1998 against Spain. France w on the&#129522; match 1 0, with Zinedine Zidane scoring the goal. Since that mat ch, France has used the stadium for almost every major&#129522; home game, inclu ding the 1998 World Cup final.&lt;/p>
